

Map showing areas in St Ives




Map 5.8 - Provision of informal open space in St Ives Market Town



	Any new housing developments should consider the need for informal open space provision. A decision regarding the most appropriate type of space to be provided should be taken in the context of other spaces in the area and access to other facilities. The recommended local standards should be applied to determine developer contributions.
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This map shows areas in St Ives with poor access to green space – not sure what can be done about it. Green space shown in red. Document says houses should be within 480m (10 min walk) to provide access to children. (Note: Warners Park not highlighted)



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
